CLUB POLICIES

Membership Dues

Dues are payable on March 31. Members must have paid or made arrangements by that date. Any member who has not paid or made payment plan arrangements by May 1 will be subject to suspension of playing and charging privileges. NSF cheques will result in immediate suspension until the account is paid in full.

Charging Privileges

Charging privileges are extended to members who have provided up-to-date credit card information to the office. All balances thirty days past due will be automatically charged to your credit card. Credit cards declined for payment will result in suspension of playing and charging privileges until the account balance is paid in full.

Leave of Absence and Membership Reimbursement

A member can receive a medical leave of absence by providing written medical validation of illness or injury from a health professional. Membership may be regained the next season if a member is not able to play golf for one season. Members must request a playing position be held for the next year by May 1 of the year in which illness prevents playing golf. Further, if a member is not able to play for more than one season, a written confirmation is required for each season missed and their position will be available in the golf season they're able to play once again.

Membership reimbursement is subject to approval by the General Manager and Board of Directors and will only be granted if determined to be medically unable to play or transferred out of town for work. No more than half of the yearly dues can be rebated. All requests for membership reimbursement must be submitted in writing by Sept. 15 of the same year.

Dress Guidelines

Traditional golf attire is encouraged, however, we are denim friendly. What is worn on the professional tours is approved. Ripped or torn jeans, non-hemmed cut-offs, athletic shorts, sweat pants, tank tops, under-shirts, athletic jerseys and halter-tops aren't permitted. Golf Shop staff have the right to deem what is inappropriate and may request a change of clothes or rebooking your tee time.

Music Guidelines

Music will be permitted after the group has left their first tee until play on the final hole has concluded. Volume control is to be set to not exceed 15 yards from the cart and on mute if at the tee box with other golfers not in your group. If the music is louder than noted, management will have the right to take action. For your safety, earbuds are not permitted on the course but are allowed on the practice facilities and putting green.

Family Packages

Package 1 – Any combination of a 2 full-member family unit with children 25 years of age and younger, residing at home and is a full-time student.

Membership Rate: Child - \$82.60

Package 2 – Any single full-member adult with full playing privileges.

Membership Rate: 1st Junior – 50% off dues, each additional child - \$82.60

Students (19 – 25) \$290.00 residing at home and a full-time student.

Package 3 – Any single afternoon or Twilight membership (excluding full members) with children enrolling in the Junior Program (8 – 18).

Membership Rate: First child is 35% off, each additional child \$82.60

*Weekday Memberships have full playing privileges from Mon-Fri with the exception of special tee closures outlined below. Monday to Friday members may pay a green fee to play on weekends and may play in weekend tournaments by paying a green fee and the tournament charge.

**The Afternoon Membership is permitted playing privileges outside their time lines but must pay the regular green fee applicable at that time of the season.

If Golf Canada Dues are required, add an additional \$38.50.

All rates are subject to taxes.

Age is as of Dec. 31.

IN-HOUSE LEAGUES

Wednesday Ladies (must be 19+; guests are permitted on a 1-1 member/guest ratio)

Tee off in a weekly 18-hole draw beginning at 9 am with organized friendly competitions throughout the season for all skill levels.

Saturday Ladies (must be 19+; guests are permitted on a 1-1 member/guest ratio)

Tee off in a weekly draw beginning at 11 am with organized friendly competitions throughout the season for all skill levels.

Tuesday Ladies Night (members and guests must be 19+)

Starting in June, every Tuesday is Ladies Night. Tee times start at 4:30 pm. There are weekly prizes and contests for players of all skill levels. Come as an individual or as a group. All members and guests are welcome. The event fee for everyone is \$10, guests must pay an additional \$20 for green fees and a power cart seat is \$10.

Wednesday Men's Day (must be 19+; guests are permitted on a 1-1 member/guest ratio)

Men's Day is open all day Wednesday and has exclusive tee time blocking from 12-6 pm. Pay a one-time league fee of \$25 and a weekly fee of \$15. Prizes are based on front-nine scores and are posted and awarded by end of day Thursday. This fun and competitive league is open to all skill levels and has live-scoring updates that are displayed directly to your phone and on the television in the clubhouse.

Super Seniors (must be 50+; guests are permitted on a 1-1 member/guest ratio)

The tee is available Thursday mornings beginning at 9 am and there is a one-time league fee of \$35 to play.

Junior Field Days (members only, no guests are allowed)

Junior field days are on Tuesdays beginning at 3 pm.

All guests playing in in-house leagues are subject to applicable member-guest rates.

TEE TIMES & BOOKING

Booking a Tee Time

Westfield has an online tee time reservation system that permits a full member to request a tee time up to seven days in advance starting at 9 pm. To book online, go to our web page:

As a courtesy to other members looking for tee times, please cancel tee times as soon as you know that you will be unable to play. Tee times may be cancelled online until the day of play. Tee times on the day of play must be cancelled by calling the Golf Shop at 757-2907.

Reserving a Power Cart

We have limited availability of power carts and as such, are not guaranteed. When you book online, click the number of carts you require **before** you choose your desired tee time. Please notify the Golf Shop on cart reservations when making a tee time over the phone.

Missed Tee Times

If an individual misses a tee time or is late they will be put into the next available tee time. In consideration to other members, if you are unable to make a tee time you are required to cancel the tee time at the earliest opportunity. Missed or late tee times will be monitored.

RECIPROCAL TEE AGREEMENTS

COURSE INFORMATION & CARE

Practice Facilities

The Practice Facilities are for members and only for guests who are playing that day. Please check in with the Golf Shop on your way to the practice facility. Twice weekly maintenance occurs on Monday and Thursday mornings and the range will reopen after maintenance has been completed.

Pace of Play

A round of golf at Westfield should take no more than 4 hours and 15 minutes during tournaments and 4 hours during casual rounds. It is a group's responsibility to keep up with the group in front. If you or your group falls behind, please invite the group behind to play through, irrespective of the number of players in that group.

Course Markings

White stakes define out of bounds, yellow or red stakes define penalty areas.

Distance markers in the fairway indicate the distance from the marker to the center of the green. Red =100 yards, white =150 yards and blue = 200 yards.

The flag colour indicates its position on the green. Red = front, white = center and blue = back.

Bunkers Care

Please fill and rake all marks/footprints in the bunker before exiting.

Course Care

Please replace and press down any displaced turf and repair any divots on the putting greens.

Green Etiquette

The putting surface should be free of golf bags and push carts at all times and the flagstick should be properly replaced in the cup when finished the hole. Players should avoid using their putters to retrieve golf balls from the bottom of the cup as it can cause damage to the cup edges.

Golf Carts

Keep carts 30 yards or more away from the greens and tees on par 4s and 5s. Cart paths only on all Par 3s. Westfield has medical flags available for golf carts to support those with mobility concerns. In order to receive a medical flag, you must provide a medical note from your doctor, subject to approval.

GOLF SHOP OPERATIONS

Golf Shop Hours

The Golf Shop opens daily 30 minutes prior to the first tee time and closes 30 minutes after the last tee time. Subject to weather.

Club Fittings

Professional club fittings are available to members year-round for \$25. The fitting fee will be credited towards any purchase of equipment.

Golf Instruction and Clinics

Private, semi-private and group lessons and clinics are available with our PGA of Canada Golf Professionals. Please check the website for rates.

Handicap Computer

The Handicap Computer is located in the main foyer of the clubhouse. Golf Canada's Handicap & Course Rating Committee recommends you enter your scores hole by hole, rather than putting in your gross score. This way the system will make the adjustments necessary to properly calculate your handicap.

RULES & REGULATIONS

All members, while on Club property, shall conduct themselves in a reasonable and proper manner and shall not behave so as to interfere with the enjoyment of Club property or a golf match. Every member who introduces a guest to the privileges of the Club shall be responsible for seeing that a similar standard of conduct is observed. Please visit the Westfield Code of Conduct on our website for a comprehensive list of acceptable behaviours and activities.

The Board of Directors may impose penalties as it deems fit, including suspension of all privileges and compensation for any damages caused.

These bylaws govern the operations of our organization and should be read in conjunction with this Westfield Membership Booklet. In the event of a conflict or inconsistency between this booklet and the bylaws, the bylaws will take precedence.

FEEDBACK/SUGGESTIONS

Westfield prioritizes its relationship with members, guests, professional staff and Board of Directors. If a member has a formal complaint it should be communicated in writing to the General Manager and/or Head Golf Professional. The complaint will be investigated and any action, if deemed required, will be initiated. If the resolution is not to satisfaction of the complainant, the issue may be submitted to the Board of Directors c/o the Board Secretary for review.
